**Tower of London** – One of the world’s most famous fortresses, here is where you can see the crown jewels, visit an armoury, and learn about all the history of this iconic World Heritage site.

**Bank of England** – This museum teaches the story of the Bank from its inception in 1694 up to its role in finance today. You can see what the bank looked like hundreds of years ago and learn about its history.

**The Monument** - Built to commemorate the Great Fire of London in 1666, The Monument boasts a fascinating history. This 202’ column designed by Sir Christopher Wren and Dr. Robert Hooke created this structure with 311 spiral steps allowing panoramic views of London at the very top.
