

LOCAL ATTRACTIONS

Sète delivers a relaxing and quiet charter destination with many beautiful and historical sites in and around the city.

IN THE CITY

Musee Paul Valery – From fine art to historical pieces from the area, this museum will give you a real view into the area

Espace Georges Brassens – Exhibit dedicated to poet and songwriter Georges Brassens

Theatre de la Mer – Fortress used until World War II and is now designed for amazing performances

Saint-Louis Lighthouse – This area offers panoramic views of the city, harbour and port.

Mont St. Clair – At 183 metres high, the “Mont St. Clair” is a wonderful place for a panoramic view of the town and its ports.

NEARBY

Marseille (73NM from Sète) - Take a scuba diving trip to discover the many shipwrecks of the Calanques

St. Tropez (150NM from Sète) – Spend the day at Nikki Beach and enjoy the coastal paths where you can admire the large seaside mansions with a great beach picnic

Cannes (170NM from Sète) – Enjoy the Iles de Lerins with its secretive beaches and view of the pine forest or come to Cannes Film Festival or Carnival on the Riviera

Antibes (170NM from Sète) – Visit one of the largest collections from Picasso or walk through the gardens to the lighthouse and on to the boutiques

St. Jean Cap-Ferrat (185NM from Sète) – Spend the day at the zoological garden, then to Grand-Hotel du Cap-Ferrat for dinner at the famous four seasons hotel

Nice (180 NM from Sète) – Walk through the Medieval Quarter to the Russian Orthodox Cathedral, or take the “Promenade des Anglais” leading to a castle lined with luxury shopping

Monaco (190NM from Sète) - Take in luxury shopping, fine dining at Michelin Star restaurants, the Monte Carlo Casino, museums or visit for the annual Formula 1 Grand Prix

Barcelona (155NM from Sète) – See some amazing parks, shop in incredible boutiques, dine in Michelin Star restaurants and admire architectural treasures

Ibiza (295NM from Sète) – The greatest destination to enjoy clubs that host world renowned DJs
